2017 Riesling Kirchberg Grand Cru Jean Sipp		£80	2018 Volnay 1er Cru Clos de Chenes, Antonin Guyon		£125
<i>Riesling, Alsace. The Kirchberg Grand Cru blooms with beautiful aromas of white-fleshed orchard fruits and hot stone. On the palate it has a waxiness which comes from its high acidity. This is a food-friendly wine, pairing well with fish or poultry. (abv 13.5%)</i>			<i>Pinot Noir, Burgundy. This wine opens with a flinty but promising hint of reduction that segues into elegant, ripe fruit. The palate defines this silkily flowing fruit as aromatic red cherry and brooding wild cherry (abv 13.5%)</i>

<i>Chardonnay, Burgundy. Magnificently concentrated, a very fine nose with aromas of acacia, honeysuckle blossoms and nuts. Very pure, mineral and powerful with a superb depth. (abv 13.5%)</i>			<i>Nebbiolo, Piedmont. Lovely aromatic intensity and purity, with brambly fruits and notes of rose petal. The palate is very powerful and concentrated with prodigious tannins and great length. (abv 13.50%)</i>		
2019 Domaine La Clef du Recit Sancerre		£65	2017 Castello Rampolla Chianti Classico		£80
<i>Sauvignon, Loire. Made by talented young vigneron Anthony Girard, Le Chêne Fourchu is made from a single hectare on pure limestone soils, with the wine matured in a mixture of oak barrels and concrete amphorae. This creates a wine with the chalky minerality of the finest Sancerre terroirs at its core, but also with the texture and richness of fine Burgundy or Bordeaux. Outstanding. (abv 12.0%)</i>			<i>Sangiovesie, Chianti. Packed full of sour cherry, lavender and black fruits with ripe and full tannins, this is a powerhouse of a chianti. Impressive now, it will reward cellaring as well. (abv 13.5%)</i>		
2019 Castello Rampolla Trebbiano di S Luca IGT		£80	2015 Podere le Ripi Brunello di Montalcino Riserva, Lupi e Sirene		£200
<i>Trebbiano, Chianti. The 2019 Trebbiano di Santa Lucia is a blend of Trebbiano, Chardonnay, Traminer, Sauvignon Blanc and Malvasia done in amphora. Readers will find an orange wine of notable structure, power and intensity. Tangerine oil, chamomile, hazelnut and spice add complexity. Stylistically, the Trebbiano is pretty eccentric compared to most of the reds, especially the flagships. (abv 12.50%)</i>			<i>Sangiovesie, Tuscany. Deep coloured, the nose is powerful, complex and multi faceted, with black fruits, sweet red cherry, tobacco, liquorice and violets. The palate is immense yet maintains fine freshness and beautiful proportion, with ripe tannins starting to soften. (abv 14.50%)</i>

<i>Carricante, Sicily. Aromas of peach and honey mingle with notable minerality. The palate has plenty of texture and vibrancy. (abv 13.5%)</i>			<i>Cabernet Sauv, Maremma. The grapes are collected from vineyards planted on the "Poggio dell'Avvoltore" hill. Its clay-limestone soil produces a strong and powerful tannin in the glass. (abv 14.00%)</i>

<i>Albarino, Rias Biaxas. Complex aromas of biscuit, caramel and butterscotch. The palate is creamy and broad with well-integrated smoky oak and lively acidity. Long, layered finish. (abv 12.5%)</i>			<i>Aromas of yellow apples, fresh pineapple, honeysuckle and a touch of cinnamon. The integrated citrus-like acidity adds a vibrant freshness to the wine. (abv 13.50%)</i>

<i>Chardonnay, Sonoma. Brimming with citrus, pears, lush floral notes and a touch of butter. It's a very well-balanced wine with great texture, intense fruity aromatics and ample acidity. (abv 14.0%)</i>			<i>Pinot Noir, Central Otago. This is a refined and elegant New Zealand pinot noir. The nose shows pristine red cherry, blackcurrant leaf and a hint of violets and the palate is lifted (abv 14.00%)</i>

<i>Cabernet Sauv, Napa. (abv 14.00%)</i>			<i>Semillon, Bordeaux. The 2016 Coutet is bold, immediate and delicious. Ripe pear, tangerine, spice, mint and dried flowers build into the soft, caressing finish.
