

THE LIGHTHOUSE

Completed in 1895, The Lighthouse was designed by architect, Charles Rennie Mackintosh and was later opened as part of Glasgow's status as the UK City of Architecture and Design in 1999.

GRAND CENTRAL STATION

Glasgow Central Station was opened by the Caledonian Railway in 1879. Boasting a rich history, it is the largest and busiest train station in Scotland.



THE GALLERY OF MODERN ART

The building was erected in 1778 as the townhouse of William Cuninghame of Lainshaw. In 1996 the building was converted to house the Gallery of Modern Art. It remains a world-class art museum and a place for people to gather and share ideas.

THE OLD STOCK EXCHANGE

The exchange was founded in 1844. In 1973, it merged with the London Stock Exchange, becoming the hub of its Scottish operations.
